

Where is Young?

approximately 70 miles northeast of the Phoenix metro area as the crow flies. From the east side of the Phoenix metro area, it is about 2 ½ - 3 hours drive to Young. From Payson: travel east on Hwy 260 approx. 32 miles up onto the Mogollon Rim to the Young Road (Forest Road 512). The sign says, "Desert to Tall Pines Scenic Byway". Turn right and travel the 21 miles through forest and about 6 more miles to our office, across from the fire station, 47518 N AZ Hwy 288.

From Globe: travel north on Hwy 188 15 miles to Hwy 288 turnoff. Take 288 North, across the Salt River bridge and continue north through the forest. About half of the total 35 miles on Hwy 288 are now asphalted. When wet, the dirt section of this road can be slick and dangerous. It is only 2 miles from where you enter Young to our office on the north side of the highway, 47518, across from the fire station.

By Air: One can fly into the airstrip located on Tonto National Forest land that parallels Forest Road 200 (also sign posted as Chamberlain Trail) an unpaved, unlighted 4200-foot runway suitable for twin-engine aircraft. It is located on the mesa about 3 miles north of the central part of Pleasant Valley. More information is available at www.azpilots.org Be sure to arrange for someone to pick you up, as there are no facilities.

Environment

Young is an unincorporated small town, formally called Pleasant Valley, with a mile high elevation surrounded by the Tonto National Forest. There are miles of trails to explore, hunt, ride on horseback and camp on. Contact the Payson Ranger District office about which roads allow Off Highway Vehicles 928-474-7900. The US Forest Service sells firewood cutting permits also. Most areas in town offer mountain views and an abundant, potable water supply. Pleasant Valley is 5,150 to 5,350 feet elevation, has 4 mild seasons and a 6-8 month growing season. Gardens and fruit trees can

flourish in Young's "Zone 7" climate. Creek beds are lined with sycamores, black walnuts, willows, cottonwoods, AZ alder, wild grapes and blackberries. News spreads via Facebook group pages, at local events & on bulletin boards at local businesses.

Weather: Most of our annual precipitation is received during winter and the late summer months of July & August. The average high temperature in January is 51 degrees. Low temperatures rarely dip below 10 F. Summer temperatures swing 40 - 50 degrees from daytime highs of 95 +/- to lows of 45-60. Winter snow storms range from a dusting to 2+ feet! History and **Community Events**

Pleasant Valley began as a cattle ranching community in the 1870's. There was a brutal 5-year, "to the last man" feud between the Grahams and Tewksburys between 1887 and 1892.

The town's name was changed because of Miss Ola Young, who served 50 years as the Postmaster.

Summer Activities: There are many archaeological and historical sites in the area. Annually, the 3rd weekend in July, Young celebrates Pleasant Valley Days with a parade and tours of the battle sites and other historic places of the "Pleasant Valley War". Tour the museums and sit in the shaded bleachers for a spell to watch the team roping.

Community Services

Young is primarily a retirement and vacation get-away community. Over half of the population of roughly 600 vear-round residents are older than 50 years. Buddi's mini market sells both unleaded gasoline and diesel from pumps that operate round the clock with either credit card or debit card payment. Many services in Young are provided only because of local people who volunteer their time.

There is an LDS congregation, a catholic worship group & 2 nondenominational Christian groups.

Young has 1 grocery store, a livestock feed store, hardware store, & thrift shop, and more.

Mechanics, auto parts store, and tire repair shop are here to support motorists. Our public library is tied to the Gila County Library system. There are 4-H clubs, FFA, & various activities other for children sponsored by the PTO. The PV Historical Society and Community Council coordinate various affairs. including the annual Gila County Fair in September. Other activities come and go depending on interest.

The U.S. Mail is delivered 6 days a week from Globe. **UPS** delivers weekdays. FedEx delivers needed.


Midvale Telephone Exchange provides local service and DSL fiberoptic Internet access. Hughes and Wild Blue offer satellite Internet service. The public phones in town (at the Post Office and school) provide free local calls, and non-coin long distance. Verizon, AT&T and T-Mobile cell phone service work well off our repeater cell tower.

Arizona Public Service provides electricity. A local man picks up garbage weekly. Satellite reception is available through Dish Network or Direct TV. Three propane companies deliver gas & lease tanks here.

Emergency/Medical

The Gila County Sheriff's Dept has 1 full-time & 1 reserve deputy residing in Young. The PV Medical Clinic is run by Cobre Valley Medical of Globe/Miami. A physician's assistant and CNA are on duty at the clinic on Thursdays. Emergencies are handled by a local paramedic,

volunteer fire fighters. We have enhanced 911 response services: addresses are connected to phone lines. Residents can purchase \$50 annual memberships with medical evacuation helicopter companies to avoid huge bills for transportation to hospitals.
